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

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












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Get on the Pro-Housing Bus

Rally Day is upon us! If you're not on the pro-housing "bus," then you're part of the problem.

On Wednesday, March 20, more than 150 builder, remodeler and associate members of the GHBA will converge upon the state capitol for a day of advocacy, education and networking in Austin. Through the GHBA, political advocacy is immediately accessible and effective. Regardless of your political leanings, you should all be pro-housing advocates and voters. Homeownership and homebuilding have historically demonstrated benefits that are easy to get behind.

Homeownership betters the lives of millions of Americans by cultivating a sense of community, creating wealth and providing financial security. In addition, there are numerous tax benefits which allow Americans to keep more of their hard earned money in their pockets.

Homebuilding and remodeling also have other great economic effects for our community. I'd like to share a number of statistics, and I encourage you to take note of their importance and share with others in your day-to-day operations.

A National Association of Builders (NAHB) study found that the one-year impact of construction of 100 single family homes creates 394 local jobs and more than \$28.7 million in income, as well as \$3.6 million in taxes and other revenue for local government. That's impressive for a single year! The benefits continue for years to come. The same study found the one-year local impact of \$1 million spend on residential remodeling generates \$841,000 of local income, \$71,000 in taxes and other government revenue, as well as 11.5 jobs.

NAHB also found that housing's combined contribution to the national Gross Domestic Product averages 15-18%, which consists of 3-5% residential investment, as well as 12-13% from consumption spending on housing services, such as rent, utilities, etc.

Housing is vital to our economy, but affordability is an ever-increasing barrier. NAHB estimates that nationally, a \$1,000 increase in the cost of a median-priced new home will price 127,560 U.S. households out of the market, with 3,622 of those being in the Greater Houston area.

Considering housing is so great for people, the economy, job creation, and government revenue AND also considering that slight increases in cost have catastrophic effects, you would assume all politicians would focus policy on housing affordability, but the facts speak otherwise. NAHB studies find, on average, regulations imposed by government account for 24.3% of the final price of a new single family home.

The facts are clear. Housing is great for you, for our city, county, state and country. It unmistakably improves the lives of individuals and communities while also generating enormous economic activity and government revenue. One can't help but wonder how dramatically results would improve and how much more accessible the American Dream would be if our government invested in affordable housing instead of creating obstacles. The call to action is now.

Even if you miss the Rally Day bus on March 20, your help and engagement in political advocacy is still critically needed throughout the year. We need people to serve as subject matter experts, attend government meetings, contribute to HOME-PAC, and most importantly to invest in themselves and their community by voting pro-housing.

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ADVOCACY REPORT

The 86th Texas Session is Rolling Along

s the legislative session enters its third month, we have reached the turning point and the time when legislation actually begins to get moving. Members only have 140 days to complete the business of the state during the session. That said, the only items that can be voted on within the first 60 days of the session are "emergency items" which are exclusively determined by the governor.

On Tuesday, February 5, Governor Greg Abbott delivered his "State of the State" address to a joint session of the Texas Legislature. The "State of the State" is the governor's biennial speech to both highlight current Texas success stories and outline his legislative agenda for the session.

In addition to discussing the need to reduce gang violence, shutting down human trafficking operations, supporting general and mental health services for veterans, Governor Abbott listed five emergency items:

- School finance reform and increasing teacher pay
- Improve school safety
- Increase mental health care services
- Property tax reform
- Disaster response and making Texas more resilient to future disasters

Declaring these items as "emergency" means that both the House and Senate can immediately begin considering bills pertaining to these items.

The GHBA is particularly interested in the last item directed largely at Hurricane Harvey recovery.

The GHBA is a founding member of Houston Stronger, a coalition of development stakeholders from around our region. The group's initial purpose was to push for the \$2.5 billion Harris County Flood Control bond election to help fund a comprehensive regional flood control plan.

Since that proposal passed overwhelmingly in August, Houston Stronger has pivoted to make a push for a substantial allocation from the Economic Stabilization Fund (Rainy Day Fund) for both recovery and mitigation projects. This was something the governor also spoke in favor of during his address.

This plan would help provide communities the matching dollars required to draw down substantial federal recovery dollars. In many cases, there are millions of dollars available to these areas, but those communities do not have the fractional matching monies that they need to receive them. In addition, it would create a Texaswide flood infrastructure fund for future flood mitigation projects. This fund would provide financing for the most effective and timely projects to protect people, property, and natural resources across the state.

We know that property tax reform and public school finance reform, along with Harvey relief funding are the major priorities this session. As the session continues to take shape and we have a more comprehensive view of what has been filed and what is being pursued, the GHBA Government Affairs team will be active in working with our delegation in Austin, as well as tracking legislation that could affect homebuilding and development.

Make Your Voice Heard March 20 in Austin, Texas

Rally Day is an advocacy event hosted at the Texas State Capitol in Austin. It is a valuable opportunity for association members to talk with our local legislators and key policy staff face-to-face.

Briefing materials will be provided on legislative issues and pending legislation that is important to the Texas residential construction, remodeling and development industry.

The day's events include a Welcome Ceremony with keynote speaker Texas Comptroller Glenn Hegar, scheduled meetings with our local legislators, and a GHBA-provided lunch with

After you register for Rally Day, you will be assigned to a team with a team captain. On the morning of Rally Day, you will be given your team assignment so you can identify your team members either on the bus or once in Austin.

You'll also be given background information of our state legislators, a map of the Capitol, talking points for your meetings and background information on legislation and issues on which you and your team will brief our delegation members.

Your participation in meetings with the GHBA delegation is critical. They need to hear directly from you on issues affecting your business and our industry in their districts and throughout the state.

This event won't take place again until 2021, so don't miss it.

City of Houston "Electronic Plan Review (EPR)" Training

This spring, the City of Houston's Permitting Center will be moving to 100% electronic plan submittal for all residential projects. While the EPR option has been available for years, it will now be mandatory.

City of Houston Permitting staff have offered to provide training courses for association members at the GHBA where they will provide an overview of the EPR process for residential buildings. They will be covering the two online systems used to complete the steps in the EPR process—the iPermits and ProjectDox applications. In addition, there will be a Q&A session with permitting staff, including Chief Building Official Mark Savasta, to address any questions related to code development, inspections, permits, and plan review processes.

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Economic Forecast predicts No Recession in 2019

f you were one of the 900+ guests at GHBA's Economic Forecast Luncheon hoping for good news in the housing market, there were a number of reasons to stay positive. Guest speaker Elliot Eisenberg, PhD, The Bowtie Economist, gave plenty of incentive for optimism.

Dr. Eisenberg predicted that prices aren't likely to crash the way they did in the bust of 2006 to 2009. During the last boom, buyers, lenders and builders were swept up in speculation, and prices soared even as a flood of new homes came onto the market. That unsustainable combination doesn't exist today, he said.

Economic conditions are not indicative of a recession in the next 12 months. In 2018 the GDP (gross domestic product), was 3% and Eisenberg sees it dipping only slightly to 2.4% in2019 with a 2% GDP growth in 2020. Several factors exist that are a good sign for the economy: small business confidence remains strong, hotel occupancies are up and new car sales were \$17 million for five straight years. Eisenberg added that in 2019 both job growth and take-home pay are looking good and government spending is still stimulant.

Taking these factors into account, he predicts a recession is not probable in the near future but cautions, "after the next 12 months, I'm not so sure."

Dr. Eisenberg also explained that "housing improvements and repairs keep rising which means that homes are aging, rates are low, home equity is good and lack of inventory growth a bit slower."

On the more negative side, Eisenberg reported that oil prices have slacked.



The higher dollar will impact exports and trade, and interest rates are also up. "Add it all up, the result is not great but is still well above the flat."

"Corporate profits are higher, but in 2019 they won't grow as fast as last year," he stated, "because of tax reform. Last year's taxes were lower than in 2017, so corporations could show large increases in corporate profit."

"Our economy can take some hits," Eisenberg said, "We do have lower oil prices, relatively weak manufacturing, and if car sales did decline, those factors alone can't hurt us. It would take much more, such as fiscal policy mistakes to make an impact."

Eisenberg reported that a \$250 billion trade war has hurt the GDP, and global growth is slowing down. "China and Japan have had economic problems and in Europe, Germany experienced a recession, and of course add the fact that Brexit is an ongoing crisis right now. All affect our GDP."

2018 was the best year for the U.S. since the recession ended at the end of 2009. "In five months, this becomes the longest recovery in history," he stated.

There is nothing resembling a recession in sight. Unemployment is low at 3.7%, people are changing jobs, no one is getting laid off. "That's a sign of a good market," Eisenberg said.

From 2010 to 2018, wage growth went from 2% to 3% and inflation has stayed

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in check. "The federal government just announced it will put the brakes on any increases any time soon, and that's good news for home builders."

Single family housing is 2.4% of the GDP. "Housing won't drive us into a recession," said Eisenberg, "it's too tiny. Homebuilders can go into recession but not the economy. We need more houses, desperately!"

The U.S. home ownership rates are rising again. Home prices are up by

3% or 4% because land, labor and materials have increased in cost and wage increases in housing are nearly double the national average. The number of people in construction is 7% less than 12 years ago and home prices are too high to sustain growth. Home inventory has bottomed out and going up. Single family new home sales are down by 3% or 4%.

"The total dollar volume is flat," said Dr. Eisenberg. "I think pricing growth appears to be topping out." Eisenberg concluded by reporting there is not a housing bubble and there is no credit crisis.

"Household debt is down, and we are in great fiscal shape." The Texas population growth is high and the fastest growing in the nation. Unemployment is very low in Texas and payrolls are up in both Texas and across the country. "Build, build, build!" he said.


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GHBA Names "Of the Year" Award Winners for 2018



And, most commendable, in the aftermath of Hurricane Harvey, DWH partnered with HomeAid Houston and other GHBA builders in order to create BuildAid, one of the region's most responsive Hurricane Harvey-related charities. Under the leadership of David Weekley and the financial support of the David Weekley Family Foundation, not only has BuildAid successfully restored countless homes hit by Hurricane Harvey, but out of the roughly 112 homes either completed or under construction, over 100 of those homes are David Weekley managed homes.

"The GHBA is honored to receive this recognition and is excited to continue our vocational training partnership with HBI," said Morgan. "The GHBA members have made the commitment to continue growing a trained building workforce for the local industry."

Each year, HBI trains thousands of individuals in brick masonry, carpentry, electrical wiring, building construction technology, heating, ventilation and air conditioning, painting and plumbing.

In June 2018, HBI in partnership with the GHBA and Norbord, officially opened the first construction trades training program in Acres Home in Houston, Texas. The program launched the first 12-week training program at no cost to students. The first 14 graduating students have since begun preparing for careers in the construction trades to address the labor shortage in the industry and help in the rebuilding of Houston post-Hurricane Harvey.






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Chesmar Homes and Toll Brothers Break Ground for GHBA Charity

The project includes a total of eight duplexes that will house mothers who have been working within the Gracewood program to rebuild their lives, to allow them to complete education and certification programs.





Safety on the Jobsite

espite the gloomy weather, the Custom Builders Council hosted a full house at the February luncheon featuring Dave Yelovich with Tilson Homes. Dave spoke on that 'other four-letter word' – OSHA.

Dave shared that the construction industry has the highest number of fatal work injuries. Texas led the nation with the most fatal injuries in 2017 with 534, followed by California with 376. Because of these high numbers, OSHA issued about 1,390 citations with penalties up to \$7 million.

The most frequent cited reasons were: not reporting within a 24-hour period that an employee was inpatient hospitalized, failing to fill out the proper forms after a work-related illness or injury, not keeping accurate records of all injuries and illnesses, and not reporting a death within eight hours.

Dave reviewed the three must-haves to stay compliant with OSHA. 1) Have a plan; 2) conduct weekly inspections;

and 3) continue to educate your employees.

Thank you, Dave, for an informative discussion, and helping us all stay on the right side of OSHA!

A New Day

olks, by the time you read this, the weather should be warming up in preparation for spring. Most likely, you will have gone to the Houston Rodeo already and indulged in a crawfish boil or two. The Houston Rodeo often serves as a signal for me that we are officially in a new year.

For those who are politically attuned, the 2018 midterms brought many new faces onto the scene including three new county judges in Montgomery, Harris, and Fort Bend counties. Our new Montgomery County judge, Mark Keough, came and spoke to the MCBDD in late January. He is bringing a fresh perspective and renewed efforts on how to tackle the transportation challenges of Montgomery County.

For those thinking about home trends, the rise of the 45' home as a cornerstone lot program has arrived. Major developers such as Howard Hughes, Johnson Development, and Toll Brothers have incorporated 45' lot programs into key positions within their communities. High-end master planned communities are routinely featuring

45' products with an average ask price north of \$300K.

This has caused many homebuilders to reconsider what a quality floor plan will look and feel like for under 3,000 sq. ft. What is the buyer of a high priced 45'wide home looking for? Community amenities, proximity to schools, proximity to work, etc. This is a time for us to think about where the profit can be captured while interest rates are rising, land prices are rising, and the Millennial buyer is pickier.

According to the Urban Land Institute, 37% of millennials are homeowners, with more millennials coming into the market every day. This presents a new opportunity to rethink how to reach our buyers, how to address their needs, and how to deliver a final product at a reasonable price. Millennials are reading the newspaper less and less, they quickly scroll through adverts on social media, and they crave authenticity.

The answers to these questions will take time and effort to solve. The transit issues in Montgomery County will take salesmanship to solve. The home affordability issue will take time and innovative minds to solve. The ability to reach out to our customers in a meaningful way will take skill and experimentation. Lucky for us, we all have a new day to work through these questions.



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
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
